Excerpt from Eastern Oklahoma The forty-sixth state in the Union, Oklahoma, embraces all the country formerly included in the Indian Territory and in Oklahoma Territory, and in area is larger than Missouri. The population has increased from 790,391 in 1900 to 1,657,155 persons in 1910, showing an increase of 866,764 or 109.7 per cent. The taxable wealth is now about \$800,000,000, and the value of farm and mineral products is more than \$150,000,000 per annum. The new state has 5,000 miles of railroad, 250,000 farms, more than 1,700 post offices and ninety or more towns and cities having more than 1,000 inhabitants. The meaning of the name Oklahoma, as explained by several authorities, is Red People, being composed of two pure Choctaw words, Okla, meaning people, and homma, red. In a treaty made in 1866 between the Federal Government and the commissioners appointed by the Choctaw, Chickasaw, Cherokee, Seminole and Creek Tribes, this name for the territory was agreed upon, and under this name it became a state. Eastern Oklahoma is the old Indian Territory, which borders...
